



Our Peer Led Internet Safety programme

Audience: Secondary school students. **Participation:** 20-30 students per session

This programme is designed to enable students to use the Internet safely and responsibly. The programme creates an IT tutor group of year 12 and 13 students who are selected by an IT teacher or Head of School to become a Be SMART mentor. The mentors will guide, support and share valuable Internet safety and awareness information with their peers and younger pupils throughout their school.

The Mentor roles include:

- Promote discussions within the school community around Online Safety, Reputation and Cyber Bullying
- Encourage and promote safe and responsible behaviour online
- Guidance for online activity and online profile reputation to every pupil
- Educate and inform on Internet safety
- Help and advise on online bullying; be a first point of contact for pupils
- Encourage and support Trend Micro's "What's Your Story" competition

How Be-Smart is delivered

Students are divided into three discussion groups, which we call the 'World Café'. Three videos are shown to the students and each group is assigned one of the videos to discuss. Finally each group presents their findings and points raised on their video to the wider group, for open discussion and debate.

These films were previous US and Irish winners in Trend Micro's "What's Your Story" Internet safety competition.

Phase 1 - The Teacher

- Download the information and programme from the Trend Micro website
- Present deliver this programme to a selected group of sixth form students which will enable them to deliver Phase 2 of the programme
- Show three short films to the group covering Your Online Reputation, Sexting and Cyberbullying
- Your selected group will need to be split into three teams, each allocated a film to discuss for approximately ten minutes
- Each group then needs to elect a table master, who at the end of the discussion period will share the opinions of the group
- Encourage open discussion with all groups about each topic, whilst offering facts and advice to conclude each film topic

Phase 2 - The Student Mentors
